## **NURSERY NURSING SUCCESS**

The students spent 18 weeks mentoring a toddler in a local nursery. The girls worked extremely hard and all of them achieved a Level 1 Qualification in Interpersonal Skills. They were awarded their certificates at an Awards Ceremony at Dukinfield Town Hall earlier this month and were described by the course organisers as 'wonderful students who are a credit to the Academy'.



### **HOMEWORK**

Homework is an essential part of a child's learning and progression whilst in Secondary School. It is used to consolidate learning in the classroom and to maintain essential knowledge and skills that all students require to prepare them for their GCSE examinations at the end of Year 11. Sometimes homework provides stretch and challenge for students and at other times it may be used to give additional practice on a skill that a student needs to develop further, but homework is always important. Recent international research shows that consistent completion of homework activities can accelerate a student's progress by almost 6 months.

This is why our Homework policy at Droylsden Academy is changing. Every day, students in all year groups will be expected to complete and hand in homework. Failure to hand in homework when required will result in the immediate issue of a 30 minute detention for students.

For students in Years 7 and 8, homework will be handed in as they enter the Academy each morning, according to the homework timetable. Homework for students in Year 7 and 8 in the prestigious EBACC subjects (English, Maths, Science, Geography, History and Modern Foreign Languages) will be issued via a homework pack that students will receive at the start of each half term. Details of the homework calendar will be in student planners and posted on the Academy website. Class teachers

in Maths and English will also set an additional homework activity each week. Other subjects will issue homework each term in a dedicated week, where EBACC homework will not be set. Students will also benefit from a 'Homework Holiday' for one week every term where no homework is set, allowing students extra time to pursue their hobbies and interests.

Students in Year 9 will have their homework set in lessons and hand in homework to their class teachers in accordance with the homework timetable. Weekly homework will be set in EBACC subjects (English, Maths, Science, Geography, History and Modern Foreign Languages). Again, other subjects will issue homework each term in a dedicated week and Year 9 students will benefit from a 'Homework Holiday' for one week every term.

Year 10 and 11 students will have their homework set for all examined subjects in lessons and hand it in to their class teachers in accordance with the homework timetable.

There will be opportunities for students to complete homework in school, either in the quiet study zone at lunchtime of after school. In September, we will share details of our new online homework package, 'Show My Homework', which allows parents and students to see the homework set by teachers and the deadlines for completion.

## THE ACADEMY MARKET GARDEN

The catering team have started growing their own produce in the Academy garden and serving it up at lunch time! Many of the students have really enjoyed their healthy home grown meals and have also seen just how easy it can be to grow your own vegetables. Any students who are interested in developing the market garden next year can get involved and may even save their parents a few pounds on the shopping bill!
