AN INCREASINGLY POPULAR AND HEAVILY OVERSUBSCRIBED SCHOOL

We are pleased that we have had over 200 first choice applications from the families of Year 6 students again this year and that, with 584 applications in total, we are, again, heavily oversubscribed. We are grateful for the trust that families have placed in us and we will continue to do all we can to become the school of choice for the local community.

The tables here show how the total number of applications and the number of first preferences for Droylsden Academy have increased over the last five years.

Following a request from Tameside, a number of schools, including Droylsden Academy, have temporarily increased their Planned Admission Number for the intake of 2021 to accommodate all the Year 6 students from a 'bulge year' where there are more students than places available.

Whilst we are delighted to be heavily oversubscribed again, we are mindful that, even with 195 places available for 2021, a significant number of students will not get their first preference of school.

GCSE COUNTDOWN

Year 11, there are only 18 school weeks left, just 90 days in school, until your first GCSE exam.

You will receive the results of your Pre-Public Exams next week. Whilst we hope and expect that many of you will be very pleased with your results, there will, inevitably, be some who are disappointed. One of the main purpose of the Pre-Public Exams is to enable you to plan the remainder of Year 11, to build on what you know and understand and to identify areas that you still need to work at.

The Pre-Public Exams will also have shown some of you that there are no short cuts and that the only way to guarantee success is through hard work and thorough preparation. The important thing for all of you is that you learn from the experience, and any mistakes you may have made, and give yourself the best possible opportunity to succeed next summer.


This week's Book of the week is 'The Time Machine' by H.G. Wells


