DRUGS EDUCATION AND SAFETY

You may remember that, last term, Year 9 students took part in a 'Drop-Down Day' when they attended a series of workshops and presentations on Sex and Relationships Education. The day was extremely successful and feedback from students and staff suggested that this format really worked well.

Next week, Year 8 students will be attending a similar day, but looking at the issues around Drugs Education and Safety. Parents and Carers of all Year 8 students should have received a copy of the following letter:

Dear Parents/Carers

Re: Drugs Education and Safety



At Droylsden Academy we aim to support students to embrace the challenges of adult life, equipping them with the knowledge and skills that will enable them to make informed decisions about their wellbeing, health and safety.

Whilst we recognise that Parents and Carers are the prime educators for children on many of these matters, the school can complement and reinforce this role by building on what children learn at home as an important part of delivering a good education.

With this in mind, on **Wednesday 15th January**, Year 8 students will take part in a workshop aimed at delivering important aspects of Drugs and Safety. The workshop will cover cannabis, alcohol, nitrous oxide and safe behaviour.

The normal school timetable will be partly suspended and the session will be facilitated by a professional and expert external agency - **Change Grow Live:** a national charity (with a Tameside division) that focusses on education and intervention with reference to substance misuse.

The workshop will take place during one period only, students should bring all their usual equipment and books as normal.

I am sure that you see the value of this important aspect of your child's education and encourage you to discuss their learning with them.
