British Science Week




First Prize: Jaaziah Cowan (Year 8)













Character Development in action!

Congratulations and well done to **Zachary Devlin** from Year 7 who completed the Manchester City 'Blue Run' and raised £79 for charity. Zach has taken part in the event for the last four years now and submitted the 'before' and 'after' photographs below as evidence against the criteria for the 'Service Pillar' of our Character Development Programme.







As you may remember from previous editions of Newsflash there are four 'Character Pillars', Learning, Leadership, Service and Participation which are fundamental to our school and students are encouraged to record evidence of how they have demonstrated these strong character traits through our Character Development Programme.

Successful completion of activities related to any of the four Character Pillars earns points towards a prestigious enamel badge which students may wear on their blazer in recognition of their achievements. There are three levels of award for each of the Character Pillars: Apprentice, Graduate and Master, with each one having gradually more challenging success criteria to meet.

Computer Science

This week, our Year 7 Computer Scientists have been applying their newly acquired programming skills and using 'Block coding' to programme their 'Sphero Sprk' Robots to create shapes, lights and sounds!

Block coding is an excellent way to introduce younger students to programming as it is very visual and easier to use than traditional text based programming. Students can practice their programming skills at home by using websites such as code.org and 'Scratch' which can be found at https://scratch.mit.edu/.




Next week, students will be attempting to navigate their robots through mazes, something that will really challenge their skills in logical thinking!

LIFE SKILLS



As part of the Academy 'Life skills' Programme, students from Year 9 will be taking part in a 'drop down day' next Monday so that they can attend a series of workshops on Relationships, Sex and Health Education. We had planned to deliver these important sessions earlier in the year but then had to postpone the day due to the enforced school closure. All parents/carers should have received the following letter which includes details of the presentations and workshops that students will be attending and taking part in.

Dear Parents/Carers

Re: Relationships, Sex and Health Education (Rescheduled due to COVID-19 Restrictions)

At Droylsden Academy we aim to support students to embrace the challenges of adult life, equipping them with the knowledge and skills that will enable them to make informed decisions about their wellbeing, health and relationships.

From September 2020 it has been mandatory for all secondary schools to deliver the Government's statutory guidance in relation to Relationships and Sex Education and, for all state-funded schools, statutory guidance relating to Health Education.

Whilst we recognise that Parents and Carers are the prime educators for children on many of these matters, the school can complement and reinforce this role by building on what children learn at home as an important part of delivering a good education.

With this in mind, on **Monday 26th April**, Year 9 will take part in a 'Drop Down Day' aimed at delivering important aspects of Relationships, Sex and Health Education.

On the 'Drop Down Day' the normal school timetable will be suspended and instead your child will take part in a series of workshops which will be facilitated by professional and expert external agencies, as well as school staff. These are:

- YouThink: Tameside's specialist team which focuses on improving young people's sexual health who aim their work at Year 9
- Tough Cookies: A social enterprise that delivers a range of education and community services on behalf of the NHS, Local Authority Public Health services and other partners. Tough Cookies deliver initiatives and projects that work to improve public health and wellbeing
- Odd Arts: A theatre company using specialist applied theatre and creative arts to address and explore contentious and challenging issues including issues related to health and exploitation

The workshops will address the following subjects:

Media Impact:

- The similarities and differences between the online world and the physical world, including: the impact of unhealthy or obsessive comparison with others through setting unrealistic expectations for body image
- Over-reliance on online relationships including social media
- How advertising and information is targeted at them and how to be a discerning consumer
 of information online

Healthy Relationships:

- The characteristics of positive and healthy friendships (in all contexts, including online) including: trust, respect, honesty, kindness, generosity, boundaries, privacy, consent and the management of conflict, reconciliation and ending relationships; this includes different (nonsexual) types of relationship
- How stereotypes based on sex, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation or disability can cause damage
- Youth and interpersonal violence; healthy relationships, mental health

'Sexting':

- Rights, responsibilities and opportunities online, including that the same expectations of behaviour apply in all contexts, including online
- About online risks, including that any material someone provides to another has the
 potential to be shared online and the difficulty of removing potentially compromising
 material placed online
- Not to provide material to others that they would not want shared further and not to share personal material which is sent to them
- What to do and where to get support to report material or manage issues online

Consent:

- How people can actively communicate and recognise consent from others, including sexual consent, and how and when consent can be withdrawn
- That there are a range of strategies for identifying and managing sexual pressure, including understanding peer pressure, resisting pressure and not pressurising others
- That they have a choice to delay sex or to enjoy intimacy without sex

Health (including Sexual Health):

- Details of various STIs, symptoms and how condom use can reduce risk
- Knowledge of the human body

Please note that the 'Drop Down Day' is compliant with our Academy COVID-19 restrictions, risk assessment and guidelines. Please also note that the day may be cancelled at short-notice if there are unforeseen circumstances (e.g. staffing issues caused by COVID-19).
