The Academy would like to thank those parents and carers who attended last week's Year 11 Parent Teacher Evening, we hope that meeting your child's teachers was useful and informative.

Thank you also to Anna Nwanze, Blessed Agbonlahor, Michelle Manuwa James, Maria Oprea, Chau Hoang and Rachel King who staffed Reception throughout the evening.

We were pleased that, of the parents who filled in an Academy questionnaire:

- 90% of them agreed that their child was happy at school;
- 98% felt that their child feels safe at school;
- 96% felt that the school ensures student behaviour is good;
- 84% agreed that the Academy made them aware of what their child would be learning throughout the year;
- 92% agreed that the Academy had high expectations of their child;

Meanwhile, Year 9 have been creating revision resources which help to explain the causes of World War 1. The enquiry question posed to the students was 'Was World War 1 an inevitable conflict?' and the resources they produced clearly explain how Militarism, Alliances, Imperialism and Nationalism created a boiling pot of tensions in the early 1900s which led to the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand and the onset of war. #### **UPDATE FROM THE CATERING TEAM**

As you may be aware, the Catering Team are serving African and Caribbean food throughout October as a celebration of Black History Month.

Last week the team served up Jerk Chicken and Chakalaka. Jerk is a style of cooking native to Jamaica, in which the meat is either dry rubbed or wet marinated with a hot spice mixture called Jamaican Jerk Spice. Spices such as Scotch Bonnet Pepper give Jerk Spice, and Jerk Chicken, its spicy 'kick'! Other spices that are used in Jerk Spice include ginger, garlic and thyme.

Chakalaka is a traditional South African dish that was popular with the families of the miners who worked in the gold mines and lived in the townships around Johannesburg. The dish is based on canned beans, such as baked beans, tomatoes onions and chillies and is hot, vibrant and really tasty!
